Prenatal injury

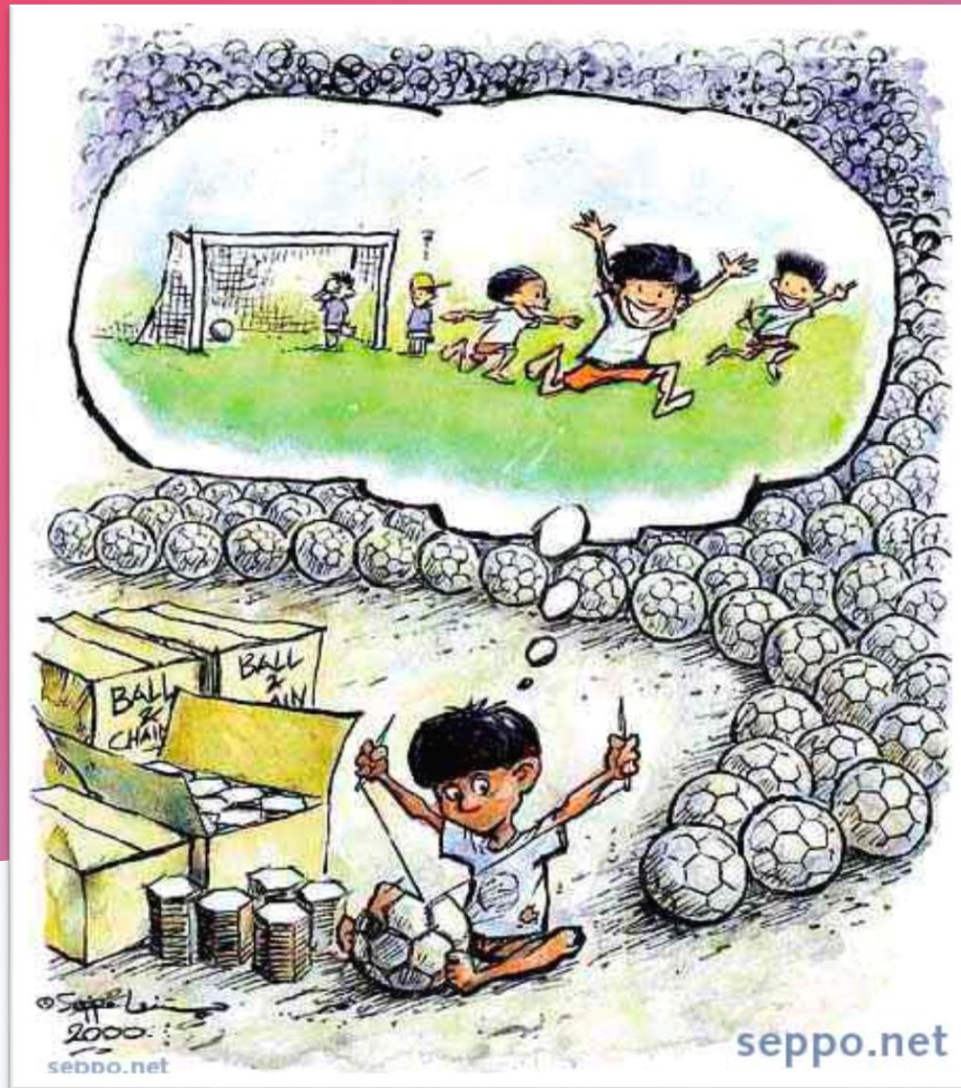
- The survey of 1377 was conducted by **UNICEF** in Iran:

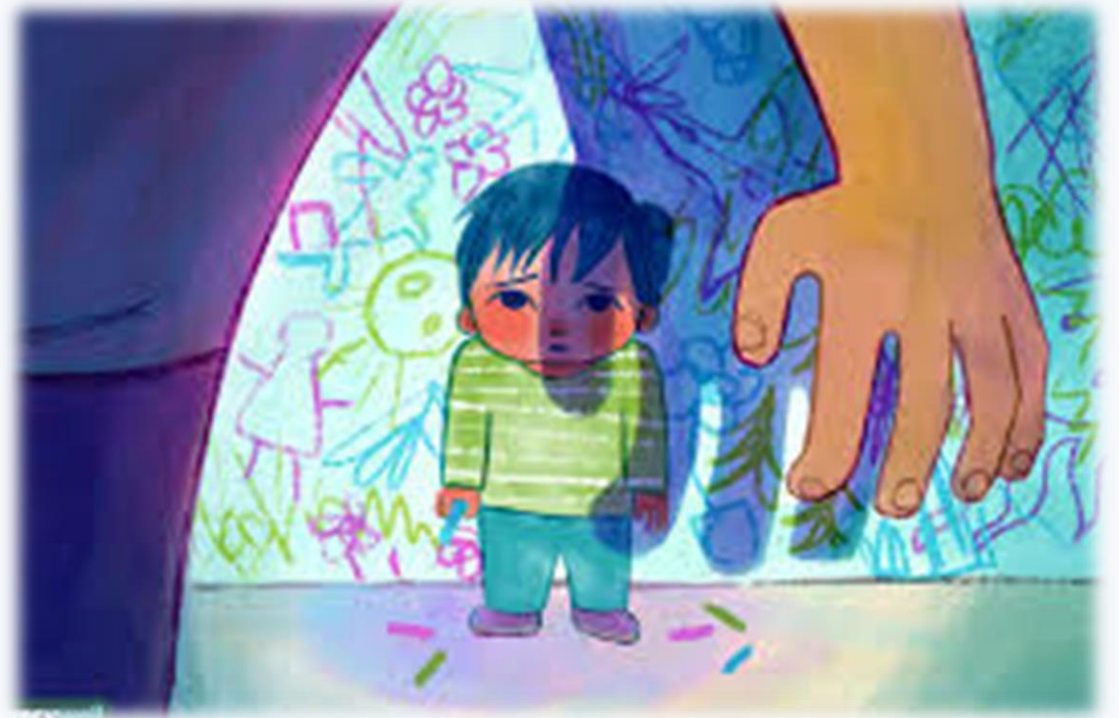
